



- Second Place in medal table of the Olympic Games of Sydney, Athens and London
- A historical tally of 250 medals in World championships.

Those results only reflect the untapped potential to develop great athletes in our sport, however we need to develop more equitable and fair conditions between our regions and implement actions to promote solidarity among the members of our Union, with the purpose of achieving our goals in the short, medium and long term. I believe is strengthening the unity among the regions of our continent, maintaining constants communication among the members of our Union and establish a clear and programmed action in order to:

 Unify the level of technical training of managers, athletes, coaches Referees and judges, through continuous and standardized training programs.

## My vision for the PATU are focused in 3 areas:

**Kyorugi**: In order to improve taekwondo in the Pan-American area, it is necessary to have a competition circuit that allow the sum of ranking points in an equitable way, taking into account that Latin American countries do not have an assigned budget in most cases.

**Poomsae**: Standardize the divisions in the Olympic circuit events as they are in WT rules. Seek the inclusion of the Poomsae in the Pan American Junior Games. Create Poomsae G ranked events circuit by region together with Kyorugi; north, central-Caribbean, and south. Promote G-ranked virtual events (giving partial ranking points).

Conduct regional training camps led by recognized coaches and outstanding athletes. Create interregional exchanges. Promote the competition format like the Universiade 2019 (recognized / freestyle). It is important to boost Poomsae. After seeing Karate Katas in Tokyo 2020, Taekwondo should show the beauty and strength of the marciality of Poomsae and the spectacularity of FreeStyle. From our position as an economically unattractive country, we strongly believe that promoting is the key to success.

Due to the economical and financial issues Cuba has faced all these years, we have very limited opportunities to acquire first-line resources that contribute to the development of adequate preparations and better talents. These big difficulties have also prevented us from participating in a significant number of first-world and rank events which have also a negative effect in the scale of positions in the ranking and consequently, in the drawing of lots in the main events.

However, under our command, Cuba has continued to train female and male taekwondo athletes throughout the Cuban geography. Promoting has been the strategy we have applied in our country and it is our work proposal for these following years of management:

-Promoting an adequate development of human talent in pedagogy as the main resource in the development of young talent in the countries that need it. This strategy can be supported by the excellent cloisters of professionals, masters and PhDs in Science and linked to the development and empowerment of taekwondo in both areas of pedagogical action, Base and High Performance. In addition, the Selection of Talent, The Training of the Coach from the vision of the correct interpretation of the elementary principles of the planning of sports training, the incentive to scientific research in order to give a solution to the real difficulties that are in the banks of problems; and the preparation of territorial managers to enable them plan appropriate work strategies depending on their possibilities and capabilities, are strategies that will help us pursuit of achieving superior achievements. Consequently, this objective contributes to the development and image of the region in competitive scenarios where other continents are imposing themselves on us today.

The diagnosis of the difficulties in the theoretical, methodological and scientific training by regions in order to increase and to specialize the preparation of personnel linked to the practice of taekwondo and increasing the quality of teaching, is also extremely important which will contribute to the objectives mentioned above.


